

GREEN ROUTE

Starting from the square in Giazza and following the signs for the green route, cross the entire square diagonally to take Via Rozza uphill (this is the road that allows you to get down to the square arriving by car from the provincial road); having reached the provincial road SP10, continue along the road for about 150 m, keeping to the right and, taking care to cross it, turn left and take path CAI no. 251 uphill: it is advisable to wear suitable footwear (even better if accompanied by trekking poles) because the path, especially if it is damp or covered in leaves, may be slippery. The path continues uphill, passing first by the place where, every year, the Boschi family revives the tradition of the ""Carbonara"" (in the Cimbrian language ""In haufe""), an ancient method for producing charcoal, and then passing alongside a llama and alpaca farm in Telderi, until it reaches, after a series of S turns in the wood (don't miss the autumn foliage), the pastures of Malga Selle.

Behind the malga, continue to the right along the wide and pleasant dirt road (note that 400 m after Malga Selle, path CAI no. 251 leaves the road to continue uphill on the left towards Campofontana, while the green route keeps to the right along the flat dirt track).

In an alternation of woodland and pastureland, you pass the Sellette hamlet on the left, after which the road begins to descend steeply through an impressive forest of tall fir trees that surround it on both sides.

At the crossroads on the Gaudi-Campofontana forest road, turn right and continue downhill until you cross the partly ruined Contrada Gaudi (after the last houses, on the right, there is an old stone fountain that once served as a washhouse for the contrada [district]). The road, now cemented, continues with a steep descent, passing just above Contrada Faggioni (on the left) until it meets provincial road SP10 again; at the stop sign, turn right onto the same provincial road and, taking care, cross it to the left of the road.

Continue for 800 metres along the completely flat tarmac road (passing in front of the village cemetery, outside which there is a drinking fountain and a small picnic area), returning to the junction with Via Rozza on the left, which this time goes downhill and leads back to the square in Giazza, where you started.

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
